Three attributes of hate speech









Hate speech can be conveyed through any form of expression, including **images**, **cartoons**, **memes**, **objects**, **gestures and symbols** and it can be disseminated offline or online.

Hate speech is "discriminatory" (biased, bigoted or intolerant) or "pejorative" (prejudiced, contemptuous or demeaning) of an individual or group.

Hate speech calls out real or perceived "identity factors" of an individual or a group, including: "religion, ethnicity, nationality, race, colour, descent, gender," but also characteristics such as language, economic or social origin, disability, health status, or sexual orientation, among many others.

What is considered **illegal hate speech** in Italy?



- Apology or glorification of fascism;
- Propaganda and incitement to commit <u>crimes of discrimination</u> based on ethnicity, national origin, and religion;
- Disseminating ideas based on <u>racial or ethnic superiority</u> or <u>hatred</u>; incitement to commit or committing acts of discrimination on racial, ethnic, national or religious grounds; display of racist emblems and symbols;
- Defamation through social networks;
- Threats.











ROUT THE REPORT

The report has been developed in the framework of the EU-funded project "STAND-UP: Standing up against hate in the EU". The project has received funding from the European Commission Directorate General for Justice and Consumers under Grant Agreement no.

The OSINT Reports Series, of which this report constitutes the ninth release, has been developed with the aim of providing an overview of the potential applications, on a European scale, of open-source research and analysis methodologies in prevention and mitigation activities directed against a range of potential threats. Each report in the OSINT Reports Series will provide insights, gathered through open source intelligence, concerning a potential threat identified by Agenfor International Foundation with the support of public and private partners.

This report outlines the findings of a hate speech monitoring exercise conducted in Italy, focusing on the prevalence and trends of homophobic hate speech, intersectionality and the response of major social media platforms — Facebook and Twitter. The monitoring almed to assess the effectiveness of reporting mechanisms and the removal of hate speech content.



Every type of content has the removal rate of about 33% or less

Conclusions from monitoring in 2023-2024



- Intersections between sexual orientation and various forms of racism;
- Scapegoating ("all of the problems are because of...", "too much tolerance towards...");
- Posts often remained online despite indications they violated standards or were restricted to certain regions.

Platform-Specific Observations:

Facebook:

- Lowest removal rate between the two monitored platforms;
- Facebook often did not provide feedback, and when it did, the response time could be up to a week or longer;
- Facebook did not disclose restriction actions, though some content appeared "faint" on pages after the monitoring ended;
- Notable issues with handling visual hate speech, such as ape gifs under posts featuring black men.

Twitter:

- Twitter's restrictions were usually applied simultaneously with feedback but were ineffective;
- **Initially** removed hate speech content, but later (by October) primarily applied restrictions without removing posts;
- Lower quality of reviews over time, with clear hate speech not being flagged as violations.

This technique was said to have been originated by Gabriele D'Annunzio. Victims of this treatment would experience severe diarrhea and dehydration, often resulting in death ^[43]


