About antisemitic myths and conspiracy theories // Trends

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- **Conspiracy theories** still highly devastating.
- Social media and Internet have enabled **far right Neo-Nazi speech to find a “second birth”**.
- **“New” online antisemitic trends** seem to have appeared,
- But **grounding some of its roots** in very old conspiracy theories and concepts.
